Welcome to the latest edition of Pension*Notes*, the member newsletter of the Cook County Pension Fund (CCPF). As always, we hope you will read this newsletter carefully, as it contains important information about your benefits.

As we welcome the New Year, we are excited to share our recent accomplishments and initiatives. As our membership continues to grow, (we added approximately 500 new retirees boosting our membership to over 18,000) we continue to explore initiatives to better serve you and manage costs. To support our growing membership we recently enhanced our website CookCountyPension.com. The website features a Retirement Estimator, an online tool to help employees estimate their future annuity. Additional content includes information about the retirement planning process as well as instructions on how to notify CCPF about important life events.

Another initiative that we are implementing is a prescription drug savings program that will provide greater value to participants by offering more access to lower cost prescriptions. This enables better collaboration against the ever-lasting costs of prescription drugs while preserving affordable access.

This year also welcomes additional funding relief. The County Fund is expected to receive an additional \$353.8 million above the statutory contribution levels as approved through the Home Rule Sales Tax. The additional funding is important in stabilizing the fund on an annual basis. As our retiree population continues to grow, longer-term measures are needed to ensure the viability of the fund beyond the next decade.

We continue to explore prudent ways to meet the needs of our members as active contributors and retirees. Please take an opportunity to visit our improved website, **CookCountyPension.com** for the latest news and updates.

Make healthy decisions now to ensure a better quality of life in the future.

When you retire, you will pay more for health insurance than you do now as an employee. The cost is even greater if you are not Medicare-eligible because monthly premiums and co-payments for doctor visits will add to your out-of-pocket expenses.

In order to keep the cost of healthcare manageable when you retire, be proactive with your health now while you are young by focusing on your personal health management. You can assess your personal health by looking at your lifestyle and identifying key factors that might indicate your future risk of a chronic condition. Here are some key indicators to be aware of:

- Being overweight
- Having high blood pressure or cholesterol
- Exercising fewer than three times per week
- Being older than age 45

Retirees and Chronic Conditions

About 27 percent of CCPF retirees have **Type II Diabetes**, which can be prevented through lifestyle changes. In other words, one out of four of your coworkers will be diabetic by the time they retire. The graphic below highlights other common health issues for CCPF retirees including **coronary artery disease**, which results from excess cholesterol in the blood, and **lower back issues**, which can be helped by losing weight.

CCPF partners with UnitedHealthcare to administer the retiree medical program and to provide a comprehensive suite of tools and resources to help retirees manage their health. Personal health management resources provided include access to health coaches, disease management programs and low cost preventative care. Even retirees with chronic conditions can make lifestyle changes to ensure their condition does not get worse.

It is important to make the connection that your health choices directly affect your quality of life in the future. Making some healthy choices now can improve your health and lower your medical costs later.


